With more than 30 annual festivals, the largest mall on the continent and lots of fresh green space, Edmonton is a popular cultural destination.


West Edmonton Mall: Featuring cutting-edge local designers and top international labels, West Edmonton Mall is the size of a small city, with 800+ shops and services.
