The City of Edmonton Heritage Planning has collected neon signs from old or demolished buildings, and they are on display on the 4th Street Promenade. The museum started with 8 signs representing early styles and iconic signage in Edmonton's history, with the goal of collecting 30. Each sign has an accompanying plaque telling the story of the neon sign.

In the 20th century, neon was an industry standard for sign makers. Nowadays, the fuel and artisans are rare and expensive, making neon signs a dying industry. The Neon Sign Museum serves as a place to display and appreciate the businesses of the past.

Ride the High Level Street Car at leisure

Take a ride through Edmonton on an historic streetcar: see spectacular views, and get a sense of Edmonton's earlier days on the highest streetcar river crossing in the world.

Ride in a beautifully refurbished trolley car that dates back to the early 1900s. Get views of the river valley you wouldn't otherwise see, and feel the breeze coming in through the window as you savour the spectacular journey across the 100-year-old High Level Bridge.

Catch the car at the Jasper Terminal located between Jasper Avenue & 100th Avenue at 109th Street. See map here. This will take you south across the bridge and back to the Old Strathcona area.

The cost to ride the train is \$6.00 return and only cash is accepted.





Explore the Royal Alberta Museum

When its doors open October 3, the brand new Royal Alberta Museum in Edmonton will be the largest museum in Western Canada and a welcome addition to Edmonton's Arts District downtown. The architecture of the building reflects Alberta's diversity of landscapes and culture. New galleries in both

the natural and human history wings will tell Alberta's incredible archaeological and cultural stories, from changing landscapes to First Peoples to where we are today. The Royal Alberta Museum has the largest public collection of early fur trade artifacts from the Hudson's Bay Company and the North West Company posts in western Canada, dating from 1790.

Other highlights:

- New programming for kids including an interactive bug room and digital sandbox
- There are 2.4 million pieces in the museum's collection
- . The new museum will be twice the size as the old one
