Explore Edmonton announces new K-Days partner and programming as event is set to return for the first time since 2019

Edmonton – Edmonton’s largest summer fair is making a return after a two-year pause due to the pandemic.

Explore Edmonton will host its first K-Days since acquiring the asset in July 2021. Edmonton’s largest summer event is a great opportunity for Edmontonians and visitors to the city to gather over the 10 days, from July 22-31, 2022.

“K-Days is an iconic Edmonton event, bringing with it an annual economic impact of \$70 million to the city,” said Traci Bednard, President and CEO of Explore Edmonton. “We know that K-Days evokes so many memories for Edmontonians; it is something our community can rally around and look forward to. We are thrilled to be able to bring that back.”

Explore Edmonton is in the process of reimagining K-Days with plans for strategic development of the fair over the next 10 years. PrairiesCan recently announced a federal investment of \$8 million for development of K-days.

As a start, Explore Edmonton is ecstatic to announce a new partnership with Indigenous Edmonton Entertainment Group Association. The IEEGA was launched in November 2021, to create a platform for high-profile Indigenous events and entertainment. Explore Edmonton and IEEGA signed a three-year Memorandum of Understanding which secures this important partnership.

“Our newly formalized partnership with IEEGA is an important step forward as we begin to reimagine what K-Days can offer to our community. Our goal is to see the Indigenous Experience at K-Days play a role in reconciliation, education, and celebration of Indigenous cultures and history in Edmonton, Alberta, and Canada,” said Arlindo Gomes, Vice President, Business Development and Venues at Explore Edmonton. “The Indigenous Experience is an integral part of K-Days 2022, and will continue to be in the future, thanks to this outstanding partnership.”

“We believe in creating a strengths-based model, to lift our people up and contribute in a positive way, changing the negative dichotomies that were created through systematic racism,” said Melanie Omeniho, Vice President of IEEGA.

“Our partnership with Explore Edmonton shows that we are capable of achieving strong relationships that will flourish in the right direction,” said president of IEEGA, Lyle Donald.

The #IndigenousExperience will run the entire length of K-Days in Hall C of the Edmonton EXPO Centre. It will showcase Indigenous culture through art, food, education and performance, including an Indigenous Art Walk and 'From Seed to Heart – medicines from long ago' display.

The North Stage on the exhibition grounds will be active every day of the event and includes a free concert all 10 nights. The almost entirely Canadian lineup includes these headliners:

K-Days will also offer some of the familiar favourites like the Kids Zone, Explore Agriculture, the Maker Faire, and SuperDogs. Other new offerings include: Baconfest, the Vintage and Outdoor Market, as well as a celebration of French culture.

The Edmonton EXPO Centre will also be buzzing over the duration of K-Days. The Imagine Monet exhibit will still be in Edmonton and will run through all of K-Days, as well, the Edmonton Stingers, two-time defending champion of the Canadian Elite Basketball League, will wrap up the regular season with games on July 23 and 27, 2022.
